

The mission of Prosthetic Promises in His Name is to serve others by providing prosthetic devices that improve quality of life, enhance function, and renew hope.




HELPING OUR NEIGHBORS

- In Zambia, most prosthetic services are concentrated in urban centers, leaving rural populations without realistic access to care. Transportation costs and time away from subsistence farming make travel to cities prohibitively expensive for most families.
- The average monthly income in rural Zambia is approximately \$150USD, while a basic prosthetic limb in a developing country can cost \$125-\$2,000USD. This represents months of income for most families, making prosthetics an impossible expense when basic needs like food, shelter, and education compete for limited resources.

Since 2012, Prosthetic Promises has made 13 trips to the Southern Province of Zambia to provide prosthetic, ocular prosthetic, orthotic, and physical therapy services.



2025 IN NUMBERS




REVENUE

UPDATES & FUTURE FOCUS

In 2025, we expanded our ability to help patients in need of prosthetic services since we had more patients contact us for care than we had the ability to see in May 2025. We established a partnership agreement with the Holy Family Rehabilitation Center in Monze, Zambia. Through this partnership, we seek to empower an existing facility in Zambia that is like-minded in assisting people in need and has a trained clinician to provide care, while also alleviating the over-capacity of individuals who have reached out to Prosthetic Promises for care.

Additionally, Katie has moved to a contract Executive Director position with PPIHN, rather than volunteer, to devote more time and effort on expanding this new partnership and PPIHN's financial capacity to aid patients in need.
